#### DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

WEDNESDAYS 3.15 – 4.45PM MS LAKE / MS WATT S3 – S6 This programme requires young people to undertake 4 activities with a given period of time, to gain awards at Bronze and Silver levels. They must complete work on a skill, a service to the Community, physical fitness and two outdoor expeditions. All activities are designed to encourage independence and form a sense of responsibility in young people and is highly recognised and commended by employers. Only the Expedition section is organised by the school, although staff help to monitor and encourage the completion of all sections, including providing support with community volunteer placements. Training sessions for the outdoor work takes place in school and includes navigation skills, teambuilding, first aid, leadership skills and more. Many staff members kindly accompany regular expeditions at all levels. Duke of Edinburgh runs all year round.

Pupils at Bronze level are involved in training periods on one evening each week, usually a Wednesday, from January to May with a few additional sessions in Sept and October. Silver candidates have several after school sessions at appropriate times, after school throughout the year.

We currently have about 100 enrolled in the scheme. Pupils in S3 and those progressing onto the next level will be informed of the enrolment process in October and a parents' information meeting will be held in November.

#### LIBRARY

The Library is open, thanks to the voluntary contributions of Mrs Morley the Librarian, at lunchtimes and after school. Pupils can exchange books, and also use the computers for investigations etc.

#### VISITS TO EXHIBITIONS etc

The Art Department organised visits to a variety of exhibitions, principally for the benefit of those studying certificate courses in Art. (Entries are made in various design competitions, and the School has an excellent record of prize-winning in this connection).

#### OUTDOOR EDUCATION

S1 Pupils will have the opportunity to experience an Outward Bound Adventure the week commencing 12<sup>TH</sup> September. All S1 pupils are invited to participate and attend Barcaple situated in Drumfries & Galloway. In recent years there has also been a week long visit to one of the Authority's Residential Outdoor Centres, such as Blairvadach at Rhu.. Usually open to Second Year pupils, the programme features such activities as canoeing, orienteering, hill walking and the like.
