

SFA Schools Quality Award for Football

Scotland manager, Gordon Strachan, has sent his personal congratulations to the school, the staff and players who have been awarded the SFA Schools Quality Award for Football. He said:

"Congratulations to Hyndland Secondary School on becoming the first school in the country to receive the Schools Quality Award. I have fond memories of playing schools football and the rivalries helped me to improve, while the friendships with team-mates have lasted a lifetime.

"It provides an invaluable step towards realising your ambitions and I urge all of the players to continue to work hard, challenge yourselves to improve every day and that commitment will serve you well in football and in life."

We are absolutely delighted to have been named as the first school in Scotland to receive the SFA Schools Quality Award for football, and hope that all our young people will continue to proudly represent the school and work hard in everything they do here at Hyndland Secondary.

Mr Downie was invited into the Clyde 1 studio on Wednesday evening as a guest on their Superscoreboard football show to discuss the award and school football more generally. 
An extra special well done goes to Alexander Goss-Pastor, an S1 pupil who decided to take part as well and amazingly achieved a silver award.

P.E. Department Health & Safety Notice

Glasgow City Council has informed the PE Department of recent updates in their H&S policy with regard to body piercings. The full Physical Education Code of Practice can be found on the Glasgow website. It states the following:

2.3 'Children/young people should change into suitable clothing and footwear for the activity.'

2.7 'Personal effects e.g. jewellery, body piercings, items of religious significance, watches, hair slides and belts constitute a hazard and may cause injury if worn whist participating in Physical Education and **must be removed**.'

The 6 week summer break can allow any piercing wounds to heal which then allows the jewellery to be removed for activities such as physical education or play. So perhaps this would be a good time in the year when pupils can have personal jewellery piercings.

2.9 'long hair is a hazard and **must be secured** for all activities'.
