Attendance at Hyndland



At Hyndland Secondary School we are fully committed to help each and every one of our learners achieve their full potential. One important ingredient to success at school is excellent attendance. We are extremely proud of the high standards which our young people meet and are grateful of the support which we receive from parents/carers with regards to maintaining excellent levels of attendance across our school.



Every school day counts:



100% attendance	=	0 days missed	=	Best chance to succeed
95% attendance	=	9 days of absence missed in a school year	=	1 week and 4 days of learning missed
90% attendance	=	19 days of absence missed in a school year	=	3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed
85% attendance	=	27 days of absence missed in a school year	=	5 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
80% attendance	=	36 days of absence in a school year	=	7 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
75% attendance	=	45 days of absence in a school year	=	9 weeks and 1 day of learning missed

There is much we can achieve by working together to maintain high levels of attendance. Please remember to call the school and speak to your young person's Pastoral Care Teacher if you would like any information or advice regarding attendance.

Hyndland Expedition 2018 - Ecuador and Galapagos experience

Following two years of preparation, our Hyndland Expedition team, comprised of 19 young people and 4 staff, spent 2 weeks in South America over the summer carrying out scientific research in Ecuador & Galapagos. It was undoubtedly an experience that everyone involved will treasure for the rest of their lives and one they hope to share with the rest of the school community later in the session.

In June of this year I was lucky enough to spend 2 weeks as part of the Hyndland Expedition exploring parts of the Amazon Rainforest in Ecuador as well as Snorkelling and kayaking in the Galápagos Islands. Both parts of the expedition could not have been more different. We spent the first week in one of the most remote and unexplored parts of the Amazon rainforest learning about the different types of Flora and Fauna by participating in surveys and lectures each day. On one of the days we climbed a canopy tower which allowed us to have a view over the whole rainforest where we saw toucans, parrots and many types of hummingbird, as well as this we were also able to see different types of monkey that inhabit the rainforest which was surreal. On the final day we trekked to the community where we met the local people who live in the rainforest and learned about the struggles they face with modern day issues such as oil drilling as well as preparing and eating the local cuisine. The second week of the expedition was spent in the magnificent Galápagos Islands where the majority week was spent in the highlands which turned out to have very similar weather to Scotland which was not ideal. However, when we returned to sea level it was sunny and hot which made snorkelling that much better as we saw many schools of fish, Galapagos sharks and even turtles just beneath us which was extraordinary. On the final day of exploring the islands we got very close to the corral getting extremely close to the sharks and even swam with Sea Lions. Looking back at the experience I feel immensely lucky and proud to have participated in the expedition. Seeing first hand the species that I had only ever seen on documentaries, visiting the Charles Darwin Centre to see tortoises that are over 100 years old as well as the afternoons we spent at the most beautiful and secluded beaches that were swarming with iguanas who call this extraordinary place their home. - Jennifer Aitken

One of my favourite jungle memories is from my very first experience of the canopy tower. Before even climbing up the tower the views of the tree itself are quite spectacular, from its roots to the trees sheer height. After climbing up the never-ending stairs you are met with an even more breath-taking view of miles and miles of rainforest. Looking out over the canopy, while trying to catch a glimpse of magical birds of every colour is such a crazy cool thing and something I will never forget. However, my favourite part of the tower was when a bunch of students from Quito also came up to enjoy the view and make some new friends. We managed to get through the language barriers and had a really great experience of talking to the students and even singing some Taylor Swift and Amy Winehouse songs. It was such a strange, yet awesome moment to be way up in an Amazon tree watching out for bird's, while an Ecuadorian student sung "Back to Black", I will never ever forget it! - Lucy Dykes Diving was by far the best experience of the trip in the Galapagos Islands. At the beginning I had mixed emotions about it. I was very excited but also very nervous as I wasn't quite sure what to expect. However, our instructor eased my worries by showing us some techniques like breathing with the regulator, what to do if your goggles filled with water, how to talk with signals, etc. When I finally got in, after panicking about flipping backwards into the water the views were spectacular. There were many fish, sharks, sea lions and the coolest thing I saw was a gigantic turtle swimming about one meter away from me.

When I then touch the seabed, I realised how amazing it felt to have this opportunity and truly got lost in the moment. This really made my expedition, as it exceeded my expectation and therefore I'm really thankful to have been given this opportunity. - Maya Pereira James
