

CYBER SECURITY COURSE





This year Hyndland Secondary has been one of the first Glasgow schools to run an NPA in Cyber Security, Digital Forensics and Ethical Hacking. It was offered to 5th and 6th years and throughout the year we have been working on a variety of skills and practices that would be useful to us if we were to pursue career in this area.

For the Ethical Hacking section of the course we have used an application called VirtualBox to create a real-life situation in which we have been able to penetrate an operating system. We have worked through a penetration test on an operating system using the tool *metasploitable* which, through the command prompt, allowed us to gain access to the machine.

After gaining access we were able to do a number of things remotely, even deleting files, copying files on to our system, logging the keys the user was pressing, taking screen shots of the computer screen while in use and even accessing the computers microphone and listening to the users of the "victim's" machine!

While taking part in this course we have become a lot more aware of the dangers present while using technology. Our class has been trying to spread awareness to the rest of the school on how to protect themselves online. A few tips are to make strong passwords on all devices/accounts and to keep them to yourself. It is advised to have anti-virus software on all computers at home and make regular backups of important data on your devices (e.g. photos, documents etc.). Implementing these strategies will ensure you are less vulnerable to malicious users.

This course has been a great experience for our class and has allowed us to get an insight into a more specialised aspect of Computing Science.

- All pupils taking a Computing subject took part in the Bebras International Computational Thinking Challenge. All pupils performed admirably, though one pupil achieved such a high result he has been invited to to take part in the National Finals at Oxford University. Well done to Jack Sutherland in 3B.

A further 20 pupils also achieved in the top 10% NATIONALLY and will get to take part in a more advanced challenge in February! Well done to all who took part!

Over the coming weeks we have a number of exciting opportunities for pupils as well...

- Some of our senior pupils will be visiting JP Morgan's Technology Centre in Glasgow to find out about their internship programmes
- In March, 42 of our senior pupils will be visiting Bletchley Park in our biennial Computing Science Trip. This is where Alan Turing's team worked to break German enigma codes during the Second World War, before spending time seeing museums and famous sites in London.



• Some of our Business Management pupils will be taking part in the "Tenner Challenge" for young entrepreneurs to turn real money into profit! This will give them real-life experience of identifying opportunities and working to achieve something

SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY

STEM club that is held in Technical every Friday lunchtime aims to provide opportunities for young people that are interested in subjects of Science Technology and Engineering. The stem club will be entering a 12 week Go4set competition on the 19th of January, where they will try to resolve a problem identified in a given brief.

It is an exciting opportunity for S2 students to make connection and work closely with people in industry, develop employability skills and apply STEM in real life setting.

BUSINESS BRUNCHES: INSPIRING SCOTLAND'S FUTURE GLOBAL WORKFORCE



10 young people from S3 had the opportunity to engage with local businesses at the University of Strathclyde on 13 January 2017. They heard from a range of business leaders who view language skills as key to the growth and success of their company. The Business Brunch demonstrated the relevance of language skills in a work context and aimed to encourage pupils to continue with their language

studies into the senior phase of their secondary education, and beyond school.

The event was organised by SCILT, Scotland's National Centre for Languages in partnership with the University Council for Modern Languages Scotland. Companies attending included Shepherd and Wedderburn LLP, Radio Lingua, Keppie Design, Bank ABC and Russian Centre 'Haven'.

Eric Balish, Director of Trade Finance Scotland and Ireland at Bank ABC and one of the workshop leaders told the learners: "Life is a competition. Most of your competitors speak at least two and perhaps multiple languages. Speaking English is simply not enough to thrive and prosper now, far less in the future. Our business is anchored in financing international trade. We have a particular focus on trade into the Middle East and North Africa and also Brazil. However, we operate throughout Europe. As a consequence it is vital that we can communicate in a broad range of languages."

Fhiona Mackay, Director of SCILT said: "Events such as these are a really important way of providing young people with high quality careers advice delivered by the business people themselves and of demonstrating to them the value of language skills in our increasingly globalised world".

Meaningful employer engagement and providing relevant careers advice are both key recommendations of Scotland's Youth Employment Strategy, "Developing the young workforce". This Business Brunch supported these aims by giving young people the opportunity to ask questions and find out more about the role of languages in the business world. The targets laid out in the Scottish Attainment Challenge are about achieving equity in educational outcomes, with a particular focus on closing the poverty-related attainment gap. Through hearing from a range of business leaders and interacting with employees, the aspirations of the young people who attended were raised.

This collaboration between schools and businesses supported Scotland's International Policy to equip young people with international communication and employability skills that they will need in our increasingly globalised society and economy.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD

Bronze Training sessions begin on Wednesday 1st February. Each training session will run from 3.15 pm until 4.45 pm. Pupils will learn how to plan a route, how to navigate in the countryside, campcraft skills, how to look after themselves, respect the environment and work as a team. In-school training provides pupils with a firm basis for going out on expeditions. Outlook Adventures Scotland staff will then provide additional training in the outdoors, bringing pupils to a level where they can work effectively and independently as a team.

Silver DofE pupils will use the experience and knowledge gained in completing their Bronze DofE to work confidently, as self-directed teams to plan their routes and expeditions. They will meet from time to time with DofE Leaders.

Primary Transition News

STEM Learning Based Visit - Thursday 26th January 2017

On Thursday 26th January we welcomed all primary 7 children from each of the four primary schools in our Learning Community. The focus of the visit was to provide the pupils with an experience in some of the STEM subjects at Hyndland which would help to contribute to work being undertaken in the primary curriculum. When the students arrived at 10am they listened to a number of presentations by some of our pupils in S1-S3 who explained the opportunities available at Hyndland for students interested in STEM subject based school clubs. Firstly Heather Watt and Anna Yeadon (both in S3) spoke about their involvement in the Lego League in the Computing Department. The girls were part of a team who took part in a competition recently to build a Lego robot. The primary 7 children even got the chance to see the robot in action in the theatre. Secondly we heard from Joe Bradstreet, Daisy Turner and Ciadh Takahashi (S1) who spoke about their involvement in the Science Club. The Science Club have been busy working on a wings project (their video can be viewed on Youtube on the following link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kMPgOkVyUUw). The final presentation focused on the STEM Club which runs in the Technical Department and was delivered by Jonas Lennie and Mila Stricevic (both S2). This club are about to start work on the school's entry to the Go4Set Competition which includes many secondary schools from across the city.

After this the P7 pupils headed to two different lessons focusing on STEM activities. Some students attended Science where some undertook electro-magnetic experiments whilst others worked on cell examinations using microscopes. The Computing lessons involved looking at robotics whilst the Technical Department delivered lessons on Engineering Science which involved looking at electronics. The staff involved in the lessons were very positive about the enthusiasm and knowledge displayed by the primary 7 children and before leaving to return to their primary schools, many of the students were very keen to tell us how much they enjoyed their visit. We look forward to welcoming them back to Hyndland in early May for more transition work.







Panel Visits to our Learning Community Primary Schools

During the weeks beginning 23rd and 30th January a number of staff and S1 pupils will be visiting the four primary schools to hold our transition Q & A sessions. At these sessions the primary 7 children are given the opportunity to ask any questions which they may have about secondary school and how the transition works. During the first week we visited Hyndland Primary and Broomhill Primary Schools and will be visiting Whiteinch and Thornwood during the second week.

At each panel visit Mrs Forrester (Depute Head Teacher for Primary/Secondary Transition), a member of our Pastoral Care Team and Ms Rennie from the Support for Learning Department will be in attendance. We are also very lucky to have such great ambassadors for our school in our first year so for each panel visit a number of S1 will be returning to speak to students from their former primary school. The students who have attended to date have done a great job and we have been very proud of them.
