Hyndland Secondary School calls out for votes to bag a share of bag fund

Hyndland Secondary School is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.

Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch its community funding scheme, which sees grants of £4,000, £2,000 and £1,000 - raised from carrier bag sales in Tesco stores - being awarded to local community projects. greenspace scotland is working with Groundwork to provide support to communities in Scotland

Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and shoppers are being invited to head along to Tesco stores to vote for who they think should take away the top grant.

Hyndland Secondary School is one of the groups on the shortlist. Our bid is focusing on developing both the green space around our school grounds and also to purchase new furniture for our school playground for student use. The eco group will be able to make use of some of the funding to help develop our school grounds by planting wildflowers and plants. We have bid for a total of £2500.

Voting is open in all Tesco stores throughout November and December. Customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the check-out in store each time they shop.
