GSFA LISBON LIONS TROPHY

Well done to our S1/S2 team who reached the semi final of the inaugural GSFA Lisbon Lions Trophy at Celtic Football Club's training ground at Lennoxton. The event, which was organised by Mr Downie, Glasgow Schools' Football Association and Celtic Football Club, brought together over 200 young people from 16 schools to celebrate the 50th anniversary of 11 local boys from Glasgow becoming the first British team to win the European Cup in 1967.

Celtic Chief Executive, Peter Lawwell said: "We were delighted to embrace this proposal from Mr Downie and the Glasgow Schools' Football Association. It is one which, in such a special year for the club will provide another very fitting tribute to the Lions. These great players, all from in and around Glasgow reached the very pinnacle of their profession and they lifted the greatest prize of all - but they started somewhere and in their early years started playing their football at school. They are the example to so many aspiring young players. Everyone at Celtic is delighted to support this great initiative and we are sure it is one which will bring huge benefits to the schools and players involved."

The tournament programme, which is available digitally on the school website, included contributions from sports journalists' Hugh Keevins and Hugh MacDonald, as well as Brendan Rodgers, Kieran Tierney, and John Clark.

Following a competitive and good spirited first day at Toryglen Football Centre, on 25th May, 4 teams qualified for the finals at Lennoxton which were held on Monday 5th June. The four finalists were Hyndland Secondary School, Holyrood Secondary School, St Thomas Aquinas Secondary School and John Paul Academy.

Our boys were terribly unlucky to lose on penalties to St Thomas Aquinas after a competitive 1-1 draw in the semi finals, before John Paul Academy won the final to lift the trophy, presented by Lisbon Lion John Clark and former Celtic captain Tom Boyd.

Mr Downie and the school would like to thank the GSFA, Celtic Football Club and all the schools, young people and parents who contributed and took part to make the event such a great success.

The tournament was also a fitting end to what has been a remarkable year for football within the school, and we are looking forward to building on this after the summer holiday. Well done to all pupils across the school who have participated so positively throughout this year!!

It is an exciting time in the life of **Hyndland Secondary** school. We have embarked on a journey which will benefit the whole school community, from pupils and staff to parents. Here's what we think you might like to know about it!

What is a Unicef UK Rights Respecting School?	<p>When schools get involved, the children learn about their rights by putting them into practice every day.</p> <p>Children and adults will learn about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) which outlines what children need to survive and thrive, becoming the best they can be and achieving their potential.</p>
Why is this happening?	<p>A Unicef UK Rights Respecting School models rights and respect in all its relationships, whether between adults and pupils, between pupils or between adults. It is proven to benefit everyone in the school community to grow and learn together. Read more about the Award at www.unicef.org.uk/rrsa</p>
How will becoming a Rights Respecting School benefit my child(ren)?	<p>This approach works in many schools across the country to improve well-being and develop every child's talents and abilities to their full potential. Headteachers from schools involved in the Award say it has improved children's and young people's respect for themselves and others and contributed to children and young people being more engaged in their learning.</p>
How can I get involved?	<p>We hope you will support the school's journey to become a Unicef UK Rights Respecting School. Please do read about the Convention and Unicef's work (see below) to see what it's all about!</p>
What is the Convention on the Rights of the Child?	<p>In 1989, governments worldwide promised all children the same rights by adopting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The Convention recognised that all children have the right to be treated with dignity and fairness, to be protected, to develop to their full potential and to participate. The rights in the Convention describe what a child needs to survive, grow, and live up to their potential in the world. They apply equally to every child, no matter who they are or where they</p>

	<p>come from.</p> <p>The Convention changed the way children are viewed and treated – in other words, as human beings with a distinct set of rights instead of as passive objects of care and charity. It is the most widely ratified human rights treaty – only the United States has not ratified it. MODERN STUDIES

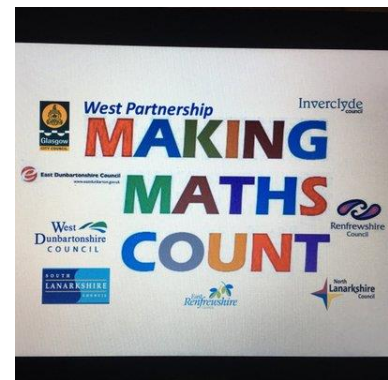

S4 POLLOCK PARK BIOLOGY FIELD TRIP

On Monday 28th and Tuesday 29th August, S4 pupils studying National 5 Biology visited Pollock Park to work on their sampling techniques as part of their Life on Earth unit. Despite rain on the Monday, pupils on both days worked extremely hard and showed great enthusiasm as they learned to use quadrats, transect lines, and even got into the river to try some kick sampling for indicator species. Particular thanks go to Mrs Samuel, and all staff who helped, for organising this fantastic opportunity for pupils.

HIGHER BIOLOGY PCR WORKSHOP

This year, all Higher biology students were given the opportunity to attend a PCR Workshop at Glasgow University on Thursday 31st August. The workshop offers pupils a fantastic opportunity to gain experience in PCR techniques and applications through lectures and laboratory work as part of their first Higher unit on DNA and the Genome. Thank you to Mrs Kennedy for organising and to all staff involved.

S2 BAE STEM Workshop

On Monday 4th September S2 attended a roadshow delivered on behalf of BAE Systems, the RAF and the Royal Navy. Pupils were treated to a show which featured drones and robots and they learned about the systems that are used to control these. The robot 'Maya' was particularly impressive as she was able to follow commands such as 'sit down' and 'do tai chi'. Pupils were able to engage with real life applications of STEM subjects and start to think about possible future career paths in STEM. Many thanks to Miss Neilson and all staff who helped make this possible.

S1 SCIENCE CLUB

S1 Science club with Mr MacVicar runs every Wednesday lunchtime in Room A208. Each week we carry out a range of fun activities and experiments for pupils and they can often take home anything that is made during Science Club. Over the next few weeks we will be producing slime, growing sensitive plants, investigating our senses and making items based around Halloween and Guy Fawkes Night. Over the course of the year, we will also participate in science based projects, some of which are competitions aimed at schools by big name companies. Pupils are encouraged to bring along any ideas that they have or have seen elsewhere.

S1 SCIENCE PUPILS INTRODUCTION

It has been fantastic to welcome our new S1 pupils into the science department, and we have been delighted by their enthusiasm and hard work so far as they complete their Safety and Introduction unit. Pupils have been learning to use basic apparatus safely before they begin carrying out more complex investigations and experiments as the year goes on.

HYNDLAND EXPEDITION 2018

Information letters were issued to pupils in June with additional updates in August. As we move through the year, pupils can expect short lunchtime meetings every 1-2 weeks to allow for information to be shared, forms to be completed, letters distributed and fundraising efforts managed. All team members are expected to be available for bag packing on Sunday 8th October at Sainsburys in Drumchapel, information on transport and times will be sent out ahead of this in September. Regular fitness sessions will begin shortly for all team members (and staff!) thanks to our school sports leaders as we begin to ramp up preparations ahead of next summer's expedition. At Hyndland Secondary School we are fully committed to help each and every one of our learners achieve their full potential. One important ingredient to success at school is excellent attendance. We are extremely proud of the high standards which our young people meet and are grateful of the support which we receive from parents/carers with regards to maintaining excellent levels of attendance across our school.

Every school day counts:

95% attendance	=	9 days of absence missed in a school year	=	1 week and 4 days of learning missed
90% attendance	=	19 days of absence missed in a school year	=	3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed
85% attendance	=	27 days of absence missed in a school year	=	5 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
80% attendance	=	36 days of absence in a school year	=	7 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
75% attendance	=	45 days of absence in a school year	=	9 weeks and 1 day of learning missed
