



# Expected levels of progression

Curriculum for Excellence defines five levels of learning;

- Early The pre-school years and P1, or later for some.
- First To the end of P4, but earlier or later for some.
- Second To the end of P7, but earlier or later for some
- Third and Fourth S1 to S3, but earlier for some.
- Senior phase S4 to S6, and college or other means of study.

2022 / 2023 - S4	>	SENIOR PHASE National 3, National 4 (assessed by teachers) & National 5 (final external assessment & coursework & Performance)
2023 / 2024 - S5	>	SENIOR PHASE National 3, National 4, National 5, Higher & Vocational Qualifications
2025 / 2026 - S6	>	SENIOR PHASE National 4, National 5, Higher, Advanced Higher & Vocational Qualifications



### **Assessment Approaches**


#### Range of approaches
