A Duke of Edinburgh's Award is so much more than a 'pat on the back' for completing a programme of activities.

It is recognition of a young person's successful journey of self discovery and development in an environment of social interaction and team working, renowned by employers and universities alike for the qualities seen in young people who have achieved a DofE Award.



What is DofE and what participants will do?

Award Sections

- Volunteering
- Learning a Skill
- Taking part in a Physical Activity
- Training in navigation, camp craft and team work
- Undertaking a 2 day expedition

Award Section Timescales

Volunteering **3** months

PLUS a further **3** months in the Volunteering, Physical or Skills section

Physical **3** months

Skills **3** months



Expedition

- You will be fully trained to undertake the Expedition section with confidence.
- Due to Covid, we <u>will not</u> be staying out overnight but returning daily.
- We work in partnership with Outlook Adventures Scotland who will supervise and assess the expedition.



Bronze Enrolment 2021-2022

Participants must be enrolled before they can take part in the DofE Award.

The participant's enrolment form and agreement can be found on the back of the Bronze Booklet. This is on the school website and can be collected in hard copy from the school office.

Enrolment forms should be returned to the school office by Friday 21st January 2022- Participants will then be enrolled with DofE Glasgow, our Licensing Office and will receive their own personal DofE number and username

by email.



Cost

- The cost of the Bronze DofE Award with Hyndland DofE Centre in 2021-2022 is £142.00.
- This includes Bronze 3 day package (2 days of a qualifier expedition and a training day)
- This fee pays for professionally qualified outdoor instructors to provide on the ground training, assessment of expeditions, safety and logistics.
- All payments are made directly to Outlook Adventures via the secure payment link below.
