Headteacher's Report

Sad start to term with the news of Aiden Pilkington's death. He graduated from Hyndland in August. School are supporting those current students who were close to Aiden. Read out a tribute to Aiden written by Ashraf.

- S1 having pastoral care appointments for settling in. Meet the Hyndland Family event being held shortly outside where S1 and a parent/carer are being encouraged to book an appointment to come and meet their pastoral care teachers and management team. Being done by house. Skills Development Scotland are going into classes as well.
- S2 Focus on relationships through PSE. 2L1 recently held their persuasive presentations and HT attended.
- S3 Settled into course choices. Core classes are about total choice; water safety, fitness, holiday Spanish, Scots language, Couch to 5k, cooking skills. Looking into introducing this for S2 to.

Family Learning – Gavin Tulloch

Meet the Hyndland Family Event 15-16th Sept_– Welcome event for S1 families after school. 3.20-5.10pm 2 sessions, split by houses. Meet key members of staff and school captains. Live music, practical cookery. Questionnaire for parents on how they would like to engage with family learning. Being held outside, back of Airlie building. Booking system to limit numbers.

Plan to continue with family challenges. There has been some uptake but looking for more to get involved. Prizes on offer. Focus on literacy and numeracy. Social events for vulnerable families. John Gillies still offering digital support 2 afternoons a week.

National Poetry Day, looking for offers of people to film themselves reading poetry aloud. Working on a communication charter, which is a flow chart showing who to contact if you have concerns.

Louise – Lovely to have all the pupils back at school, lovley buzz about the place. Clubs back up and running and big uptake. Thanks to Tom, Colin, Alastair & Alison for their support.

Tom Wilson – thanks to Louise and to Ashraf for his tribute to Aiden.

Q: Alastair Dalton – water fountains are still out of use.

A: LE – waiting on response from Jim Wilson (head of service) on update regarding fountains.

Q: Robin – Covid exclusion criteria

A: Positive lateral flow test requires a PCR test and then isolation until that result is known, if positive then 10 days of self isolation. If family member has positive test result then PCR also required. Can't return to school until after a negative test or 10 days isolation.

Big uptake from seniors with lateral flow tests.

Q: Ian Marland – When will school trips resume

A: No foreign trips currently planned but Mandy Maguire has asked to organise an English trip to London so planning has started.

Q: Hannah Mathers – Will school encourage the vaccine uptake in 12-15yr olds.

A: There are mixed views amongst society on this topic and school will be no different. School will give information only and ultimately it will be up to young people and their families to decide.

Q: Amy Bryson – Could there be a way for parents to leave question/message for a particular teacher

A: Gavin Tulloch – not sure that's a good idea. Pupils already have teachers glow email address and teachers could be overwhelmed with issues. Pastoral care is a better route to do down especially if there is an issue between a pupil and teacher.

Q: Ammar Sherzad – could the newsletter be sent out by post?

A: LE – School went away from printed copy of Hyndland news because it went in school bags and never saw the light of day and it is expensive to print. Sway is more accessible but if there is a specific issue call office and they can have a copy printed for someone.

Point of Family Learning Group

Made up of pupils, staff & Jodie Stewart (DHT). Help parents get more involved in school and feel comfortable coming into school. Allows parents a better understanding of what school is trying to do and to communicate how to support pupils study.
