Dear Parents,

I wrote to you at the beginning of this month to update you on what our plans were as we move out of the global pandemic lockdown phasing and promised that I would keep you informed of any developments.

Once again I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all that you have done to help support your child's learning – I know that this has not been an easy task under such a challenging set of circumstances.

Wednesday 24 June is the last day of our school term and I welcome and support the news today by the Deputy First Minister John Swinney who's announced that if spread of the virus continues to be suppressed and that the data and scientific evidence supports it, our schools can be back full time at the start of the new term in August.

Our schools and nurseries will remain in contact with their parents over the summer holidays with any updates and information that they need to share ahead of the beginning of the new term.
