

### My World of Work

· three engaging, interactive tools for pupils to use with their teachers

- · My Interests, Skills Builder and Animal Me help pupils learn about skills and how to develop them
- · beginning of young person's career management skills journey.

### The SDS Careers Adviser in your school will be involved in the support of your child as they move from primary to secondary school

- · all pupils will have a group session with their Careers Adviser on transition days or early in their first year
- · the session will raise awareness of big decisions ahead, build on their career management skills and ensure they're registered on My World of Work
- · drop-in sessions open to all pupils from first year.

- · opportunity of a one-to-one interview with a Careers Adviser ahead of subject choices
- group sessions introducing My World of Work subject choices tool, further developing Career Management Skills and preparing for key decision making
- · drop-in sessions open to all pupils · enhanced support in third year for those who need it, this can include additional one-to-one time and group sessions.

- Colleges will open for August course applications mid January.
- City of Glasgow College normally opens first.
- Young people have to be prepared for courses opening so they can apply as soon as they open.
- School will help with preparation process through college workshops and individual appointments.

## FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED!

- Many college courses open and close within days!
- Selection often done by who applied first.

### **COLLEGE APPLICATIONS**

- Need a college account to apply.
- They make an account by registering with an email address.
- Can be hard in school to make college account if they cannot access their email on the phone.
- A functioning, sensible email address, which they can access, is required.

### **COLLEGE PERSONAL STATEMENTS**

- Around 300 words
- Things to cover in your personal statement:
  - Why you are interested in the subject
  - Skills, qualities and experience you have that are relevant to the course (<a href="https://www.myworldofwork.co.uk/tools/about-me/start">https://www.myworldofwork.co.uk/tools/about-me/start</a>)
  - Volunteering / hobbies that are relevant

## BEGINNING COLLEGE COURSE RESEARCH

- It is useful to know what college course level they will be applying to.
- It is a common mistake to forget about S6 subjects and apply for the wrong course!
- It's important to remember to include <u>all</u> of their qualifications, including S6 subjects.

## **COLLEGE COURSE LEVELS**

College Course Level	School Grades Required
Introduction / Access / NPA	Sometimes no grades required
NC / NQ / NPA	A range of national 4 or national 5's are required
HNC	1 + Highers are required
HND	2 + Highers are required

- This is a rough guide and you should check with each college/course.
- This is the minimum entry requirement.
