S1 Classes - Gathering of Information

- Meetings between DHT /P7 Class Teacher and Ms Letford and Miss MacFarlane
- Detailed information gathered on every P7 young person
- Plan for supports to be in place for August
- Share key information with staff

What information do we gather?

- Working levels within literacy and numeracy
- Progress within the level are young people beginning to work at this level or are they making good progress within that level?
- Further information gathered from Literacy and Numeracy visits
- Strengths and any barriers to learning.
- Pastoral information including friendship group
- **Health** information allergies and other important information.

How we organise the classes

- 180 Pupils in S1 best groupings for learning
- If a S1 student has siblings at the school already we will try to maintain the house link as this works better for families.
- At least one other boy/ girl from primary
- 20 pupils in practical class for Art, Drama, Music etc
- 30 pupils in tutor class Languages, Social Studies, PSE
- Mixed ability classes
- Some setting in Maths not till October

The role of a Pastoral Care Teacher

- First and main link between home and school.
- Monitor and support attendance and time-keeping.
- Support young people in their house group throughout their time at secondary school - particular focus on social and emotional wellbeing.
- Delivers PSHE weekly to students in House group.
- Coordinates wider support and opportunities
- Provides advice on subject choices/careers at transition points.
- Support into a positive destination beyond school.

- School Counsellor
- Mental Health First Aiders trained in the school to offer support
- Active Junior Council
- Anti Bullying Policy in conjunction with Respect for All Scottish Government advice

The role of Pupil Support – Supporting learning at Hyndland Secondary

Supporting Pupils

- ASN Database individual profiles highlighting any identifications, support strategies and assessment arrangements;
- In class support;
- Pupil Support Hub timetabled resource for identified pupils;
- Seasons for Growth;
- Targeted 1:1 for resilience, emotional regulation, and curricular support.
- Induction Days and First Week Pupil Support Worker assigned to classes to help escort classes around the buildings.

Transition Support

- Practice journey to school;
- Talk about and work through any worries;
- Create daily checklists to help with organisation in the mornings and evening e.g. bag checks, water bottle, habit stacking;
- Consider colour-coding organisation.

F.A.R.E. Workers Jenny Wainwright & Angela Boyle

- Work directly with young people and families in a non-judgmental way empowering them to get the most out of the educational opportunities available.
- Experience of planning and delivering needs led programmes by working alongside the school, local people, and other organisations
- Offering a variety of different training opportunities including manual handling, health and safety in the workplace, first aid training, mental health first aid and SQA qualifications.
- Meet with young people individually or in groups to support them to improve attendance and/or attainment.
- Attend meetings with the **Senior Leadership Team and other agencies** that can support students to improve their attendance and/or qualifications.
- Work in **partnership** with parents, carers and young people in a school context to enable students, particularly the most disadvantaged, to have full access to educational opportunities and overcome barriers to learning and participation.
- Sound knowledge of the issues faced by children, young people, adults, and families lead groupwork for young people and events for family learning

What can parents do to help with the transition?

- Talk: listen to your young person's fears, it is normal to feel nervous about starting secondary
- Build their confidence, reassure, be positive
- Encourage participation in clubs
- Trial run of route to school
- Organisation: colour coding timetable, folders, routine
