
SPERO MELIORA - I HOPE FOR BETTER THINGS

Homework

Point to consider – are you doing everything that you can in every subject to ensure the best grades?

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
Attendance

- Attendance at school is vital if you are to achieve well.
- The skills that you are developing in the Broad General Education are vital for success in S4 and above.
- On average, our top performing 20% of S4 students had an average attendance of 97.49% whilst the bottom 20% had an average attendance of 73%.

Time Keeping

- As well as attendance, time keeping is just as important.
- Classes start promptly at 8.45am – therefore students should not be continually arriving late to school.
- If you have a class period 1 and are consistently late **which will impact on your chance of success.**

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Merit System

- Demerits can also be issued by staff.
