Dear Parent / Carer

Following the reporting exercise for S2 students undertaken in October, subject teachers have recently given a subsequent indication regarding progress for all pupils. It is vitally important that a steady and consistent work rate is maintained throughout the session if pupils are to achieve their full potential.

Similar to the first report in S2, the report enclosed again provides an indication of the working level that your child is currently maintaining in each of the curricular areas. Generally speaking, most young people will move from level 2 in primary 7 onto level 3 Experiences and Outcomes. Some learners are likely to progress to study level 4 at appropriate points during S2 or S3.

The report again also contains a grade for progress which helps to identify how your child is progressing within the level that they are currently working at. This grade equates to either 'on track with planned learning' or 'not on track with planned learning'. It may be if a young person has just begun the work at a higher level, such as level 3 or level 4, they may be 'not on track with planned learning' as they have only started this more challenging level of work which is not a cause for concern.
