- It recognises people's learning and gives them credit for what they've achieved.


THE SCOTTISH CREDIT AND QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK

Why attendance matters




The top performing 20% of S4 students had an average attendance of 97.49% whilst the bottom 20% had an average attendance of 73.98%.



Those in S4 who are currently on course to pass 8 National 5 awards in May had an average attendance of 96.87%.

How Parents can help

Talk to young people about their phone use



English (N4 & N5)

Course Content:

N4 and N5 English equips students with essential reading, writing, talking and listening skills.

Assessment Overview:

- N4 learners will undertake in-class assessments throughout S3 & S4.
- N5 learners will complete a Portfolio and an externally assessed end of year SQA exam.
- All learners will undertake regular formative & summative assessments including an S3 exam and S4 prelim.

Learning and Career Pathways:

Learners successful at N5 can progress to Higher English and further to Advanced Higher in S6. They can also progress to Higher Media in S5/6 too.

English opens a door to myriad career pathways, careers in the Creative Arts, Teaching, Journalism, Writing, Social Work, Social Subjects all require excellent Literacy and Communication skills gained in English.

In addition to Humanities, many STEM University courses will expect a Higher English pass alongside Science and Maths qualifications.



What does this mean for qualifications?

This will allow most young people to attain eight qualifications at the level most appropriate to their ability by the end of S4. In S4, young people who demonstrate a talent for Maths may be presented for Applications of Maths as an additional qualification

Young people expected to achieve 8 N5 qualifications may add N5 PE in the wellbeing column. Pupils can balance coursework and exams by choosing a mixture of NPA NA National 5 qualifications.

Some DOs and DON'Ts



Remember that you are choosing a course that you will study through until the end of S4



Listen to advice from your teachers, your parents, and Skills Development Scotland. Choose a <u>BALANCED</u> timetable. You **should** have a range of different types of subjects.

Pay Attention	Read your S2 Report carefully. Play to your strengths and choose subjects you have an aptitude for.
Consider	Consider also how much you ENJOY a subject. You should enjoy learning!
Remember	Remember to think about what you may wish to do in Fifth and Sixth Year

What you shouldn't do:

- Don't narrow your curriculum e.g. Choose three Sciences or three Social Subjects. You can access the third subject in S6
- Don't base your decision on friends' choices you have different talents!
 Classes are mixed so you may not be together.
- Don't choose a subject just because you like (or dislike) the teacher. You may have a different teacher next session.
- Don't give up a subject without finding out if you need it for a specific career you hope to pursue.




