S4 Steps to Success Parents Meeting – Thursday 1st December 2022

Following the first tracking report that our S4 learners and families received we are now able to share details about the arrangements for our first parents meeting due to take place on Thursday 1st December.

During this evening, appointments with individual subject teachers will be targeted with learners and their families where a grade D or no award has been given for a subject(s). The main reason behind this is that we use this meeting to focus on all learners in the senior phase (i.e. S4, S5 and S6), so have to target the appointments due to time constraints.

We would like to reassure you however that you will have an opportunity to meet with your young person's teachers individually at the full S4 parents meeting that will take place on Wednesday 22nd February.

As your young person has not received lower than a grade C in any of their subjects in the first tracking report, we would instead like to invite you along to some workshops on that evening which we hope you will find helpful.

WHAT WORKSHOPS WILL BE RUNNING FOR S4 FAMILIES?

- Workshop 1 Study Skills practical advice on the best ways to study for each subject.
- Workshop 2 Senior Students will share some advice on being successful in the senior phase
- Workshop 3 Coping with exam stress some guidance on how you can help to support your young person during the senior phase
- Workshop 4 Careers input information on how we support our learners with college, university and apprenticeship applications

DO I NEED TO BOOK TO ATTEND THE WORKSHOPS?

There is no requirement to book the workshops - we will issue the timings in advance so that you can decide
