## Why attendance matters in the Senior Phase

- The top performing 20% of S5 students had an average attendance of 97.49% whilst the bottom 20% had an average attendance of 73.98%.
- Those in S5 who are currently on course to pass 5
  Higher awards in May had an average attendance
  of 96.87%.



### 1 – Timetable Expectations

- EVERY S6 learner MUST select a minimum of four subjects – this is not negotiable and is expected of every S6 learner.
- Some learners may be required to study 5 courses based upon prior attainment from S5 again this is not negotiable and determined by the school.



### 2 – Adding value to your qualifications from S5:

- Returning to S6 is a huge commitment it is vital that this is the correct decision for you!
- You must ensure that you are building 'significant value' to your qualifications achieved in S5 by returning to school.
- Returning to S6 to repeat / upgrade all subjects studied in S5 is definitely not recommended!



### 3 – Commitment to fulfilling course requirements

- S6 Students will be asked to sign a S6 commitment in June stating their commitment to fulfilling the requirements of their full timetable during S6.
- Families will also be asked to sign this.
- This will be sent to families in June as part of the Induction – via a glow form.



### 4 – Attendance and Time-keeping

- S6 students are expected to maintain excellent standards of time-keeping and attendance.
- PTPC will be asked to discuss this in any reference written for college / university / employment or training.



### 5 - Role Models of Hyndland Secondary School

- It is paramount that our S6 learners remember they play a very important role in our school community.
- Our S6 students should lead by example at all times in their actions and conduct either in the school or within our local community.



## 6 – Paying something back to the school community

- We are hugely proud of the opportunities available and supports our students receive.
- Our expectation is that all S6 students should strive to 'pay something back' to our school community through volunteering and leadership

## Entrance requirements for selected UCAS courses – for September 2022 start:

- 20,710 Scottish school leavers have applied to a Scottish university this application cycle, equating to 300 additional applicants.
- As of 26<sup>th</sup> March, with our current S6 cohort 155 decisions were still to be made by Universities this indicates that many establishments including Edinburgh and Glasgow, are making offers much later in S6 highlighting the importance the value they place on students fully completing all courses in S6.



## Entrance requirements for selected UCAS courses – for September 2022 start:

• 'Scottish Universities are expecting many more applications from Scottish Students this year which may result in a delay on offers being made to Students until March, therefore it is crucial Young People continue with their committed courses throughout Secondary School'.



## Entrance requirements for selected UCAS courses – for September 2022 start:

- Universities have up until the end of April 2022 to reply to any applications.
- Universities have also commented in the press that dropout rates amongst first year students are often higher amongst those who do not continue with a full commitment of study in S6.





  - ➤ National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher levels have some internal assessments, some coursework assessed by the SQA (reduced subjects in session 2021-22) and an external SQA examination
  - ➤ National Progression Awards (NPAs) are internally assessed.



### Where are we now?

- Senior Phase Options booklet posted on year group team on Monday 14th March.
- Presentations will be posted by Principal Teachers onto the S5 Team before the Easter break to view.
- Information Evening tonight presentation will be shared on year group team and also posted on school website.
- S5 into S6 Options leaflet issued to students on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> March and emailed to families.



### Key Dates to be aware of:

- From 14<sup>th</sup> March, Skills Development Scotland will conduct targeted one-to-one interviews with students in S5 students.
- Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April final working grade report will be emailed to families it is important to use this information to inform decision making for S6.
- If anything changes dramatically, we can address this in August – but realistically its unlikely to change much.



### Key Dates to be aware of:

- Week beginning 18<sup>th</sup> April final S5 into S6 Option
   Form should be completed via glow form link which will be sent to families and posted on team.
- Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> May one-to-one interviews with S5 students and their Pastoral Care Teacher to review course choices – times will be posted on year group team.



- Look back at the subjects you sat in S4 at National 5 level – are there are any subjects that you passed but did not take forward in S5 – consider doing these at Higher level.
- Ensure you are on track to leave with a minimum of 5 Highers by the end of S6 if you can!



- English ensure you have a minimum of N5 but preferably Higher by the end of S6.
- Maths ensure you are able to leave school if at all possible with a minimum of N5 in Maths or Application of Maths. Seek advice from Mr Henderson if you need advice regarding this.



- Before selecting Advanced Highers, ensure you have a wide enough breadth of Higher passes

   remember you are aiming for a minimum of
   by the end of S6.
- Do your research to ensure the universities you intend to apply for, 'double count' Advanced Higher AND Higher passes – some don't!!!



- Use your tracking report from S5 to help your decision making.
- What are your areas of strength –build upon this for example if you are strong in Modern Studies Higher in S5, consider Politics and/or another Social Subject as a crash Higher.
- If you are good at H Maths and H Physics consider a crash H in Engineering Science.



- Think carefully about whether or not you re-sit courses in S6.
- If you are planning to resit a Higher in order to upgrade it, it is vital that you speak to your Pastoral Care Teacher or House DHT asap for advice – it does not always work so please seek some advice before making this decision.



- Some students may request to do a course at a different school because we do not offer this here.
- We would encourage students to consider the negative aspects of this.
- From our experience students find this difficult to manage for a number of reasons including having to arrange / pay for their own transport, loosing time in other H & AH courses due to timetable clashes and also going into a brand new school environment is not easy for any students.



### Senior Phase College Options

- Mr Mullin provided information about these courses available in S6.
- Students who have been given a place have been informed.
- If you have signed up for this, you must fulfil this for the full session.
- Speak to Mr Mullin asap if you wish to considered for a reserve list if any places arise.



### What will the S6 option form look like?

- We are simply going to ask our students to select four courses (along with a back-up fifth choice) from a list of subjects – essentially a free choice.
- We will then speak to young people concerned if we are unable to meet their combination of subjects requested.
- This will be done via a glow form w/b 19<sup>th</sup> April.
